"The project, which began in March 2024, aims to enhance basic facilities and improve infrastructure in rural areas, bridging the gap between urban and rural communities," the statement read.

Besides SK Nanga Tebat, other recipients include Betong Vocational College, Rumah (Rh) Entebang Nanga Belaie, Rh Liman Legan Nanga Entalau, Rh Gaerddrick Lidong Asal, Rh Jelanie Nanga Darai, Rh Mulok Nanga Kujuh and Rh Unya Jambu Lalang.

The project involves upgrading works such as the installation of solar lights, water pumps, roof repairs, fence construction and the provision of sports facilities at the school and vocational college.
